From 1970 to 2010, the average size of a new house in America has almost doubled. Yet in recent years, many are redefining their American Dream to focus on flexibility, financial freedom, and quality of life over quantity of space. These “Tiny Housers” live in homes smaller than the average parking space! *TINY*

takes us inside six of these homes, exploring the owners’ stories and the design innovations that make them work. *TINY* is about a generation that is more connected, less tied-down than ever, and a society redefining its priorities in the face of a changing financial and environmental climate.
